KRW LAW PRESS RELEASE 23.02.2025

We represent four Families whose loved ones were either killed or injured in the 1987 Enniskillen Bombing.

They are deeply concerned about reports on revelation by journalist Martin Dillion contained in his new book, *'The Sorrow and the Loss'*.

The Families we represent know that it was the PIRA who planted the Bomb in Enniskillen on the 8 November 1987.

However the claims made by Martin Dillion, despite his caveat that such claims must be treated with considerable caution, raise the following issues of grave concern,

1. *'The British and Irish Government scrubbed files relating to the Enniskillen Bombing...'*
2. *Several sources he (Dillion) trusted confirmed that British and Irish Governments concealed 'this document'*
3. *'...concealed claims that the state knew about the IRA attack and allowed it to happen'*
4. *Assertions that M15 'tampered with the bomb's timing mechanism determining that the explosion would devastate the IRA's public image'*
5. *"Highly classified" papers were never made public.*
6. *'British and Irish Governments have been "sitting" on such papers'*
7. *Including papers on '...an MI5 Agent who "broke ranks" and complained that the agency allowed the bomb to happen...'*
8. *'...matters arose which muddied the waters in intelligence corridors' in Northern Ireland'*
9. *Suspicion '...that state assets were part of the planned bombing in Enniskillen'*

These allegations are against the British and Irish Governments and their respective Intelligence Agencies.

Post the Legacy Act the only available mechanism to investigate these highly sensitive allegations is by way of a Public Inquiry under Section 1 of the Public Inquiry Act (NI) 2005.

We are now writing to the Secretary of State; the Home Office and the Irish Government urging a S1 Public Inquiry analogous to the Omagh Bomb Inquiry. ENDS
